

LOCATION

GREATER BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS

PURPOSE + INTENTION

Building upon the Northeast region's DEI efforts and the commitment of those within the Boston office, we have partnered with educational and community organizations to advance equity and inclusivity. These passion projects follow two streams:

- Investing in the **next generation** through design education, mentorship, and support, through organizations including NOMA, ACE and local colleges, universities and high schools. The team aimed to serve a diverse population, all underrepresented in architecture and design by providing design agency to young people and exposing them to the various fields within the design industry.
- Through **community engagement** and pro-bono projects, we were able to commit time, resources and leveraged alliances in order to give back to our communities that are in need the most.

PROJECT PIPELINE

EDUCATION | LET'S ARCHITECT! with THE BOSTON CHILDREN'S MUSEUM

PARTNERSHIP:

BosNOMA, Boston Children's Museum
NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS:

200 Kids (ages 2 to 10)

DATE:

March 2023

Kids of all ages had a chance to engage in a variety of fun design and build activities alongside professionals in Architecture. Activities included learning how to read and draw basic floor plans by creating their own room, exploring use of materials by imaging and creating their own creature houses, learning about the how cities are created by contributing to the LEGO city and exploring VR through headsets equipped with different landscapes and sites from other cities and countries.

IMPACT:

Exposure to a larger demographic of kids from all cultural backgrounds and age groups that may not have the opportunity to be exposed to architecture and the design of cities through this lens.











EDUCATION | EARTH DAY DESIGN WORKSHOP

PROJECT PIPELINE

PARTNERSHIP:

BosNOMA, YBB Designery, MassART NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS:

20 Students (ages 14-17)

DATE:

April 2023

BosNOMA in partnership with Youth Build hosted a 1-Day, earth day work shop at Mass College of Art & Design. The students were prompted to design an outdoor pavilion that is directly located and viewed from their makerspace. The students also leaned about technology and it's direct connection to sustainability and to green structures design.

IMPACT:

Specifically targeted to high school students with a mentor ratio of 1:2 the students were introduced to the concept of design, technology and sustainability on a deeper level. The students were also able to create mentorships that are ongoing with professionals from both architectural and construction backgrounds.









EDUCATION | PROJECT PIPELINE SUMMER CAMP

PROJECT PIPELINE

PARTNERSHIP:

BosNOMA, Northeastern

NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS:

22 Students (ages 9-12)

DATE:

August 2023

This 3-day camp focuses on introducing middle school students to architecture through the lens of their community. The camp was hosted at Northeastern University's School of Architecture and students learned the basics of urban planning in terms of neighborhood context, architecture and what it means to work together.

IMPACT:

Specifically targeting students at the middle school age understanding that introduction into the industry and the pivotal role their voices and skill-sets in the future can have on their communities may have more impact at this age.











PROJECT PIPELINE

EDUCATION | HISTORICAL ARCHITECTURE FIELD TRIP

PARTNERSHIP:

BosNOMA, Society of Historical Architecture

NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS:

25 Students (Middle, HS, Undergrad, Grad)

DATE:

October 2023

This day trip hosted by BosNOMA was made possible by a grant from the Society of Architectural Historians. This trip allowed for students to experience a piece modernist architecture (The Gropius House) as well as landscape architecture in the form of large scale sculptural art at the deCordova Sculpture Park.

Mentors and guest architects conducted a series of drawing exercises where students sketched building and park details both interior and exterior. The mentors shared a series of sketches from their career journey and discussed the art of communicating ideas through the art of sketching.

IMPACT:

Through this field trip, it was a unique opportunity to engage a true pipeline that included students in middle school, high school, undergrad, and grad alongside professionals creating moments of learning across ages and perspectives.

Nationally recognized as a day or service, BosNOMA in collaboration with Gensler Boston and volunteers throughout the industry helped to sponsor an MLK Day of Service that provided 50 care packages to those affected by homelessness through the On the Rise organization. Thoughtful notes and needed care items were stuffed in the bags and then delivered to the organization.

IMPACT:

Leveraging our resources and our allied firm partners to show up and provide for those who are in need of basic care products.


Opportunities included events such as


